



You plan your route. Everyone will go separately and maybe along different roads. Most of the answers are on the main roads or readily visible from the main roads. Many are easy to find, and some require a bit of thought. None of the clues are difficult or tricky! You may have to walk as far as 100 feet a few times to read letters on a sign. You can even get the answer at some locations while sitting in your car. You can reach all clues via paved roads that are in good condition.

You will drive in a 20 x 15-mile area north and east of Canandaigua Lake. The entire drive should be about 80 miles. It is best with two people per car, and they work together. However, you can do it alone. Gas, restrooms, and food are available at many locations along the way. Last year, everyone completed the event in about three hours.

Every year, on the Friday after Labor Day, Watkins Glen celebrates the Grand Prix Festival. For those of you who are unfamiliar with racing and Finger Lakes history, in 1948, Watkins Glens hosted the first post-World War II auto race in the USA. Cars raced on the local roads including running straight through the middle of town. The racing continued each year until following a fatal accident in the 1952 race, after which the race moved to a dedicated track and later to its current facility now called Watkins Glen International (WGI).

The weekend after Labor Day, WGI hosts a weekend of Sportscar Vintage Racing Association (SVRA) vintage car racing. On the Friday, many of these vintage race cars come down from



WGI en masse, lap the 6.6 mile "old course" (which still exists pretty much as it did in 1948) and park on Franklin St for the evening. Spectators line the streets to celebrate a tribute to the return of these vintage racers to the village of Watkins Glen. During the day, a number of "tours" are held for the auto enthusiasts where you drive your car along a prescribed course, have a group lunch, do laps of the old course, park in a group and generally have a good time. One of these is the "Sporting Roadster Tour". This is limited to sporting convertibles to which the Miata/MX5 certainly qualifies and a number of our

members participate every year.

Whether you come for the evening to watch the cars roar through town, see all the cool cars parked in town, spend the day on a tour, or attend the vintage races at WGI, it's a great time. I encourage you all to check it out! See GrandPrixFestival.com for full details.

Keeping Up The Shiny Side - Washing, Waxing & Detailing

Hello Fellow Miata Folks, ©

Now that we've taken our Miatas out of storage, looked them over carefully and taken care of any maintenance issues for the new driving season (tires, oil change, fluids, inspection under the hood, NYS DMS inspection, etc.) it's time to consider a truly first-class detailing.

Not only will a good wash, wax and detailing make your car look snazzy, it'll also help protect and preserve the paint, convertible top and leather seats (if applicable). This is especially important on older Miatas. And besides, it's fun on a hot day with a cold beer!

I have attached a link to a very, very "O.C.D." detailed list for what I do each spring. I admit to being a perfectionist but I hope you can find a few things that would be helpful in taking care of the "aesthetic" parts of your Miata.

In the meantime, here's a quick list of the most salient points to consider before you read the attached detailed list:

- Good car wash soap WITHOUT WAX
 ADDED like Mother's or Meguiars, etc. (Do
 not use dish detergent it'll strip your wax
 and tends to spot as it dries.)
- Soft sheepskin wash mitt.
- Chamois cloth to pre-dry your car after washing and rinsing.
- Couple of microfiber towels for final dry (won't leave lint).
- Good convertible top cleaner and protectant like RaggTop or 303 Top Cleaner/Protectant. (DO NOT use dish detergent or car wash soap.)
- Good quality car liquid or paste wax. The new "ceramic" waxes are great too.
- Good quality leather cleaner and protectant for leather seats.
- Spray bottle of window cleaner (nonammonia that is bad for vinyl).

Nice to have:

- Clay bar for removing paint contaminants before washing.
- Liquid swirl and haze remover (not rubbing compound) great for picking up faded paint before washing.

Suggested progression:

- Thoroughly rinse entire car with plain water.
- Clean the convertible top first with appropriate cleaner (not car wash soap) and a soft brush and rinse well.
- Clean the wheels and tires with a soft brush (not the one for the top) and a bucket of water with car shampoo. Rinse well.
- Wash the car 2/3's of the way down all around with your soft mitt and bucket of car shampoo. Dunk mitt often in the bucket.
- Then go around and wash bottom 1/3 of car all around that is the dirtiest part.

- USE UP AND DOWN, SIDE-TO-SIDE MOTIONS – DO NOT WASH IN A CIRCULAR MOTION (causes swirls in the paint).
- Rinse well and dry with your chamois, rinsing it occasionally with clean water.
- Dry completely with microfiber lint-less towels.
- Clean the glass windows inside and out with paper towels.
- · Vacuum the inside thoroughly.
- If using, apply the convertible top protectant after top is 100% thoroughly dry.
- For touch ups between washings, I use a good silicon detail spray and a microfiber towel I keep in the trunk.

Just so you know, I hate shiny *Amor All* and shiny tire stuff. I use a <u>matt-finish</u> protectant product for vinyl and plastic parts.

All items above are available either Walmart, Target or a good auto supply/parts store.


