#### Saturday, July 16, Exploratorium 2022 (Note date correction to July 16)

Come and enjoy a great ride in the Finger Lakes while searching for answers to clues. We will provide you with a list of clues to identify something specific and a map showing you where each item is, but not which clue is at which location. You plan your route, and each Miata/MX5 can go a different way. Most of the answers are on the main roads. A few are off the main road but visible from the main road. Some are easy to find, and some are less easy to find. None of the clues are difficult or tricky! A few items require you to walk as much as 100 feet to read letters on a sign. At some locations, you will be able to get the answer while sitting in your car. You can reach all clues via paved roads that are in good condition.

You will be driving in the area bounded by the Thruway to the north, but not driving on the Thruway, Canandaigua Lake to the west along its length, and midway to Seneca Lake. The entire drive should be about 80 miles. It is best with two people per car, and they work together. However, you can do it alone. Gas, restrooms, and food are available at many locations along the way, especially in the northern part of the drive. You can stop at the RUSHCO Oil (gas station and more), 1 Warehouse St, Rushville, shown on the map, in the southern part of the drive.

This event is NOT a road rally or a poker run.

Breakfast is at Roy's Restaurant at 8:00 am. we will meet to start the event here.

Lunch is at Ray's Restaurant afterward, at about 1:00 pm.

She flew as one of the lead aircraft dropping paratroopers in the first strike of D-Day in 1944. This great aircraft is still flying! With any luck, we may actually get to see this great plane in the air.

Incidentally, rides on this incredible aircraft are available but must be booked in advance. To do that, go to this webpage.

Other planes on display include a C-130 Hercules, a C-119 "Flying Boxcar," a C-45 Expeditor, a PT-26 trainer and more.

There are also outstanding static exhibits depicting life at home and abroad during the years of WW II. In addition, the Museum displays a military uniform collection as well as military vehicles and other artifacts.



There will be no admission charge to the Museum but they do encourage visitors to donate as this is a non-profit organization and every little bit helps keep their mission alive.



The museum has been renovated with several new displays since some of us were there three years ago. The entrance fee is \$3.00, a special group rate for our Club. ### Friday, September 9, Watkins Glen Grand Prix Festival NON-CLUB SPONSORED EVENT - For Informational Only

Every year, on the Friday after Labor Day, Watkins Glen celebrates the <u>Grand Prix Festival</u>. For those of you who are unfamiliar with racing and Finger Lakes history, in 1948, Watkins Glens hosted the first post-World War II auto race in the USA. Cars raced on the local roads including running straight through the middle of town. The racing continued each year until following a fatal accident in the 1952 race, after which the race moved to a dedicated track and later to its current facility now called Watkins Glen International (WGI).

The weekend after Labor Day, WGI hosts a weekend of <u>Sportscar Vintage Racing Association (SVRA)</u> vintage car racing. On the Friday, many of these



vintage race cars come down from WGI en masse, lap the 6.6 mile "old course" (which still exists pretty much as it did in 1948) and park on Franklin St for the evening. Spectators line the streets to celebrate a tribute to the return of these vintage racers to the village of <u>Watkins Glen</u>. During the day, a number of "tours" are held for the auto enthusiasts where you drive your car along a prescribed course, have a group lunch, do laps of the old course, park in a group and generally have a good time. One of these is the "Sporting Roadster Tour". This is limited to sporting convertibles to which the Miata/MX5 certainly qualifies and a number of our members participate every year.



Whether you come for the evening to watch the cars roar through town, see all the cool cars parked in town, spend the day on a tour, or attend the vintage races at WGI, it's a great time. I encourage you all to check it out! See GrandPrixFestival.com for full details.

## TECHNICAL TIPS – "Wench With A Wrench" By Gail Wagner – Midstate Miata Club of NY



Keeping Up The Shiny Side - Washing, Waxing & Detailing

Hi, Miata Folks,

Here's some great tips to keep your Miata looking brand-new along with some great advice I've learned from a professional detailing expert and car collector. Follow my suggestions and your Miata/MX5 will look like it just came out of the showroom when you're done.

You'd think washing your car would be pretty straightforward and simple: a little soap, some water, wax, a few towels, maybe a cold beer ....? Nope. It's way more "technical" if you want to preserve your paint finish and expensive your convertible top but it's fun and definitely worth the hard work. While no serious hand tools are required (thankfully), the following items are highly recommended. An investment in the right stuff will make a big difference in the finished job and much easier on you. And remember - the best carwash is your hand!

#### Stuff to Have Ready and Available:

- a garden hose with water supply.
- two buckets of clean water (one for car wash soap and one with plain, clean water to rinse your wash mitt).

- a clean, soft wash mitt (I like the big, soft sheepskin mitten type or microfiber mitts).
- a clean chamois cloth rinsed out in plain water.
- a big bunch of microfiber non-lint towels. Do not use linty bath towels, cut up old undies or paper towels!
- a single-purpose, long-handled soft brush for cleaning wheel wells, wheels and tires.
- a single-purpose soft brush for gently cleaning your convertible top.
- a vacuum cleaner or shop vac with hose and flat crevice tool for interior vacuuming.
- about 1-2 hours of time, some good tunes and a lotta' elbow grease. (I personally prefer 80 decibels of early 60's *Rolling Stones* for car washing motivation. (2)

#### **Products To Consider:**

Any good quality product such as *Mother's* or *Meguiars* is fine.

- good quality plain old car wash soap without the wax added in the soap. DO NOT use dish soap or laundry detergent. It strips protective wax coating and has a tendency to spot the finish as it dries and it's not good for convertible tops.
- "detail" silicone spray quick shine (I love this stufffor spot cleaning and quick shine-ups between washes).

- a good quality car wax (any good quality liquid or paste is fine). The new "ceramic" waxes are amazing too.
- a non-petroleum, non-acid based tire and wheel cleaner (acid-base will ruin the wheel clear coating and petroleum products not good for the tires).
- glass-cleaner, non-ammonia (ammonia is bad for vinyl upholstery and interior panels and it stinks!).
- A good quality leather cleaner/conditioner if you have leather seats (lucky you; I'm jealous).
- IMPORTANT: "Ragg Top" brand Convertible Top Cleaner and Top Protectant This is one product I really highly suggest. It's recommended by leading convertible top manufacturers. Ragg Top will gently clean, condition, protect and restore your top to its original look. It ain't cheap but worth every cent and available on-line. Be sure to get the cleaner and protectant made specifically for either vinyl top or cloth top, whichever your Miata has. My detail expert friend does not recommend car wash soap or detergent on the convertible top.

#### Not Necessary But Nice to Have:

- a clay bar (available in auto products shops to capture embedded contaminants within the paint before waxing).
- an air compressor with hose to blow dust and detritus from the heater and A/C ducts and to dry between badges, nooks and crannies after washing to prevent spotting/streaking.
- a good quality liquid swirl and haze remover product (not "rubbing compound").
- a good quality liquid paint finish restorer (amazing for oxidized paint to restore the color and glossy finish).
- RainX for your clean windshield and rear glass window (I don't like to drive Scarlet in the rain but sometimes it's unavoidable around here! <sup>(3)</sup>

#### So Let's Get It On, Literally:

- 1. Convertible top: Do this first. Find a shady spot in the driveway out of the sun. You're gonna' clean the convertible top first. Rinse the top thoroughly with the garden hose. If using Ragg Top Cleaner, spray it on the top in a small reachable area and scrub lightly with the single-purpose very soft brush. Rinse well and go on to another small area until the entire top is cleaned. Do not apply the Ragg Top Protectant spray until the top is absolutely, positively, completely dry.
- 2. Wheels, wheel wells and tires: Do this second. Shoot the garden hose spray under the wheel

- wells and at the wheels and tires to rinse off surface dirt. Spray the tires and wheels with wheel/tire cleaner and scrub with the long-handle single-purpose wheel cleaning brush rinsing after each wheel is cleaned. Run the brush inside the wheel wells to clean out the accumulated dirt and gunk and rinse with the hose.
- 3. Washing the Car: Finally, rinse the entire car except the convertible top with the hose and add car wash soap to one bucket of water and fill the other bucket with plain water. Carefully wash your car with the wash mitt and then dunk in the plain water bucket after a few soap passes (this will help to remove dirt and grit off your mitt and help prevent paint scratches and swirls) and then back into the soap bucket. Important: Do not wash in a circular motion; use vertical and horizontal strokes only to prevent ugly paint finish swirls. This is a professional detailer's tip. Wash the entire car with soap only 2/3 of the way down the doors. Do not rinse. Then wash the bottom 1/3 of the car all around since that's where the car is usually dirtiest as you don't want to pull dirt into your wash mitt and scratch the heck out of your paint on the top half. Don't forget to frequently dunk in plain water! Rinse the entire car well after you have completed washing it.
- 4. Dry the car with the chamois and microfiber towels: Use the clean, wet, wrung-out chamois cloth to go over the entire wet car and window glass to mostly dry it, dunking frequently in clean water and wringing out thoroughly. Do not use circular motions to dry. Do a final dry with your microfiber towels (available at Walmart, Target or any auto parts store). If you have an air compressor, use it to blow-dry the top, wheels, badges, nooks and crannies to prevent streaking and spotting.
- 5. Convertible top protectant: If you are using the recommended Ragg Top Protectant, carefully spray it on a microfiber cloth or clean sponge and wipe completely over the surface of the completely dry top. Wipe off any extra with a microfiber towel. The protectant picks up the top color and makes it look like new. Honest. Wipe off any product that gets on the window glass or paint.

- 6. <u>Clean your window glass</u> inside and outside with glass cleaner and a clean, dry microfiber towel. Don't use linty paper towels, old bath towels, etc.
- 7. <u>Vacuum</u> the interior thoroughly, address any upholstery or carpet stains (I like *Blue Coral* upholstery cleaner for both) and dress your leather upholstery with cleaner/conditioner, if applicable.
- 8. <u>Trim Restorer:</u> I am not a big fan of shiny AmorAll. I use an Adam's <u>matte-finish</u> product made especially for interior and exterior vinyl and plastic trim but there are other good ones out there
- 9. Waxing: Yeah, the hard part. If you have any energy left (if not, take a break, have some lunch and a beer and come back and finish) this is the most important. The factory-applied clear coat on your Miata is probably worn off by now as it doesn't take long. Waxing is important as it absorbs stains and small scratches and protects the paint from UV oxidation. Liquid or paste wax is equally good these days. You might try the new "ceramic" coating that last guite a while and leave a really high-gloss "wet" look. Just be sure to use up-and-down, side-to-side right angle application and removal (no circular motions) to prevent paint swirls. Use your clean, dry microfiber towels to remove it and another clean one to final polish. (FYI, the pros use two coats of wax.) Wax once a month, if possible, and use a detail silicone spray for touchups in between waxes to shine 'er up and remove paint-damaging road tar and bugs.
- 10.Tip: If you drop your microfiber towel on the ground, don't reuse it as it has a fatal attraction to dirt that will scratch your paint finish.
- 11. Yup, there's more. If you're feeling really energetic or want your Pride & Joy to look especially spiffy (for a club event?), try these before washing and waxing:
  - a. <u>Liquid Haze & Swirl Remover/ Liquid Paint Restorer:</u> I'm not talking about harsh "rubbing compound" here. If your paint is older, a product like this will pick up the color like you can't believe and remove some swirls and scratches. It doesn't take that long and you won't believe the difference.

- Just be sure to save some energy to wax afterwards to protect that finish. I don't recommend power buffers for this unless you really know what you're doing. Ever see a car with super-big paint swirls all over it? My point.
- b. Clay Bar: If you're a real detailing fool (unapologetically, that's me) try this: Put your hand in a clean, plastic Ziploc bag and run it lightly over the surface of your clean car. Feel rough or slightly bumpy? You're feeling surface contaminants that have become embedded right into the paint finish and haven't been removed by conventional washing/waxing. This is what the clay bar and detail silicone spray is for. It's a mixture of a clay base (polybutene) and various soft abrasives but detailing clay is not abrasive to your car's paint; it's abrasive to paint contamination. It works by hydroplaning (floating) over the surface you're cleaning on a thin layer of clay lubricant (detail spray). Before waxing, spray some detail spray on a piece of clean clay bar that you have stretched and folded over in a small handheld piece. Wipe in vertical and horizontal strokes over the surface of the whole car body, stretching and folding the clay over and over to obtain a clean piece occasionally. If you drop it on the ground, throw it away and use a clean piece. Rinse the entire car when you're done to remove the clay residue. Try the plastic baggie thing again. Feel smooth as glass? Proceed with your personal waxing ritual.
- c. <u>Detail Spray:</u> More obsessive-compulsive behavior. © I cover my car after every outing but before I do, I take my silicone detail spray and a microfiber towel kept in the trunk and remove all the splashed dirt, bugs and road tar from Scarlet's nose, bottom of her door sills and behind the wheel wells to help preserve the paint and keep her looking spiffy. I freely confess to doing this in the dark with a flashlight after a late-night drive. Yes, I know, can't help it....I'm certifiable. ©
- p.s. Maintenance tip: Don't forget to check your oil dipstick level, coolant level, window washer fluid level and tire pressure while you're thinking about it.
