You plan your route, and each Miata/MX5 can go a different way. Most of the answers are on the main roads. A few are off the main road but visible from the main road. Some are easy to find, and some are less easy to find. None of the clues are difficult or tricky! A few items require you to walk as much as 100 feet to read letters on a sign. At some locations, you will be able to get the answer while sitting in your car. You can reach all clues via paved roads that are in good condition.

You will be driving in the area bounded by the Thruway to the north, but not driving on the Thruway, Canandaigua Lake to the west along its length, and midway to Seneca Lake. The entire drive should be about 80 miles. It is best with two people per car, and they work together. However, you can do it alone. Gas, restrooms, and food are available at many locations along the way, especially in the northern part of the drive. You can stop at the RUSHCO Oil (gas station and more), 1 Warehouse St, Rushville, shown on the map, in the southern part of the drive.



HAVE YOU LOST YOUR SPARK?
What you need to know about spark plugs

Hello, Fellow Miata/MX5 Folks. When was the last time you either looked at or changed your spark plugs? They play a big role in starting and keeping your Miata/MX5s running smoothly. ©

#### **A Little History**

An electric spark plug was first used in a gas engine in 1860!


Early patents included some from Nikola Tesla (you know him) in 1898 and Robert Bosch in 1902, the first commercially available high-voltage spark plug. These developments made the spark-ignition engine possible that we drive today. Other improvements were made by Albert Champion (you know Champion spark plugs) and a Guinness brewing heir, Keneim Guiness (I assume you know Guinness ©). And yes, a <u>woman</u>, Helen Blair Bartlett, played a vital role in making the spark plug insulator in 1930. ©

#### So What is a Spark Plug?

Our Miata/MX5s have four of them and can't run without them. The spark plug (plugs) function is to make a spark to ignite a compressed air/fuel mixture in the cylinder that starts the engine and allows it to continue to run. The spark plug is composed of a shell, insulator and central conductor/electrode. They are specified by size (thread or nut), sealing type, and spark gap.

#### What Does a Spark Plug Do?

The plug's metal shell is screwed into the engine's cylinder head and electrically grounded. The plug is connected to high voltage generated by an ignition coil and spark plug wires or individual coil packs in newer Miata/MX5s. As the voltage rises, the resulting gases become ionized. The ionized gasses become a conductor which allows current to flow across the plug gap. The spark's intense heat causes the ionized gas to expand quickly creating combustion that fires up your engine and pushes the piston down within the cylinder. As you drive, the plugs keep firing and igniting to keep the engine running. That they are so essential to vehicle

operation, the condition of your plugs directly relates to the performance of your engine.

#### Replacing Spark Plugs

At one time it was common to remove plugs, clean deposits off the ends and file the end of the electrode to restore sharp edges. This practice is no longer recommended as modern high-temperature electrodes made of platinum or iridium have longer lifespans. Manual cleaning can cause a weak electrical conduction path and weaken the spark. And plugs are cheap relative to current labor costs. (Remember your dad removing, cleaning and re-gapping the family car's spark plugs? ©)

The good news is that spark plugs are pretty durable and don't need to be replaced very often. BUT forget the 75,000 – 100,000 mile replacement in your owner's manual. Prudent Miata/MX5s owners change their plugs (and/or spark plug wires depending on year of Miata/MX5) every 30,000 miles or even sooner if ignition problems arise. Thankfully, changing plugs (and spark plug wires if applicable on older Miata/MX5s) is pretty simple and can be done right in your driveway with a couple of socket wrenches and taking your time. If I can do it, you can do it. Otherwise, it's a fairly quick job for your mechanic.

Just make sure to use the recommended spark plug in your owner's manual. Spark plug coil packs in newer Miata/MX5s never need maintenance replacement unless they are determined to be bad for some reason, which is unusual. Be forewarned: the OEM iridium spark plugs for newer Miata/MX5s are about \$14.00 - \$15.00 each. It's recommended you replace spark plus wires when you change to new plugs if you have an older Miata/MX5 equipped with them rather than coil packs. They're usually under \$50.00 for four.

#### Signs of a Bad Spark Plug

You may notice that your Miata/MX5 is idling rough (sounds rough and jittery when running at idle), misfiring (momentarily cuts out and feels jerky), surging (uncomfortable and potential dangerous) or engine "knocking" (this is very serious and can cause engine component failure). Or you may have trouble starting or notice it's using a lot more gasoline than usual. Another common problem is lack of acceleration (a bad fuel filter will also do this). You or your mechanic can pull plugs and look for signs of fouling or carbon deposits, etc. to determine any additional problems. (p.s. In addition, reading spark plugs is a diagnostic tool for finder other problems in the engine, such as rich fuel mixture, carbon build up, shot rings, etc.)

#### This is another friendly summer maintenance reminder for your consideration.

The President has issued an emergency waiver to allow the use of E15 gasoline this summer, it is normally only available in the winter. Historically, you may purchase non-ethanol, E10 (10% ethanol), E15 (15% ethanol - only in the winter), and E85 (85% ethanol). This is in an attempt to increase the supply of gas, reduce the price of gas, and reduce the inflation rate.

This **MAY** or **MAY NOT** be a problem for your car.

The U.S. Department of Energy has a website titled Alternative Fuels Data Center, where you can read more.

I encourage you to read your Miata/MX5's Owners Manual to see what type of fuel Mazda recommends for your specific Miata/MX5.

#### Getting the salt out of the Car Carpets

Here's one I found that works.

- · Remove as much salt as you can with a vacuum.
- Mix a solution 50/50 of vinegar & water in a spray bottle.
- · Spray affected areas until they are wet.
- · Let them dry (I left mine overnight).
- Use a stiff bristle brush on the affected areas to loosen the salt.
- Use the vacuum as you are brushing the areas.

You may have to repeat the process as needed.

I suggest doing this outside with the windows & doors open.
