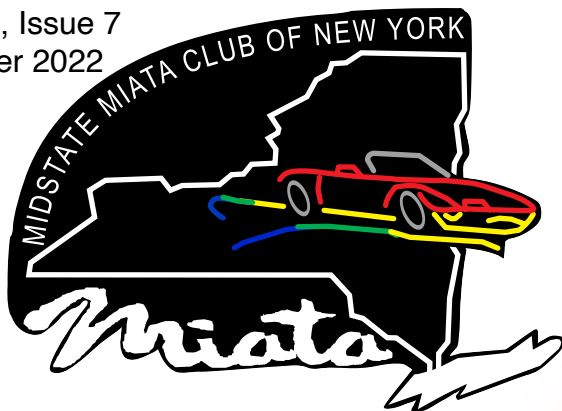

President's Letter from Karen McKissock

Well, I have a couple important things I'd like to cover this month.

First, we should all be excited that we are back to hosting our Annual Holiday Party. Later in this newsletter you will find details for our 2022 Annual Holiday Party. Please check it out and you'll find a holiday gift from your Club's leadership team. We have agreed to authorize the use of Club treasury funds to pay for this year's party. That's a biggie and I'm sure it will be greatly appreciated; however, we will tighten up registration so it's as fair as possible to everyone. **Registrations will not be accepted before October 1st and no later than October 30th.** There is an 80 person capacity constraint because of the size of the party house. Any registration received after the limit of 80 people or 30th will be held in case there are cancellations prior to the party and so we don't have to pay for them. Those members on that waiting list will be called to see if they still want to attend.

Second, I need to have a housekeeping discussion with all of you. We have a growing problem with

Event Coordinators put a lot of time and effort into the details that must be in place to host a successful event that we all enjoy. Let's try to respect them and the great job they do as VOLUNTEERS. Friday, September 9, Watkins Glen Grand Prix Festival

NON-CLUB SPONSORED EVENT - For Informational Only

Every year, on the Friday after Labor Day, Watkins Glen celebrates the [Grand Prix Festival](#). For those of you who are unfamiliar with racing and Finger Lakes history, in 1948, Watkins Glens hosted the first post-World War II auto race in the USA. Cars raced on the local roads including running straight through the middle of town. The racing continued each year until following a fatal accident in the 1952 race, after which the race moved to a dedicated track and later to its current facility now called Watkins Glen International (WGI).

The weekend after Labor Day, WGI hosts a weekend of [Sportscar Vintage Racing Association \(SVRA\)](#) vintage car racing. On the Friday, many of these vintage race cars come down from WGI en masse, lap the 6.6 mile "old course" (which still exists pretty much as it did in 1948) and park on Franklin St for the evening. Spectators line the streets to celebrate a tribute to the return of these vintage racers to the village of [Watkins Glen](#). During the day, a number of "tours" are held for the auto enthusiasts where you drive your car along a prescribed course, have a group lunch, do laps of the old course, park in a group and generally have a good time. One of these is the "Sporting Roadster Tour". This is limited to sporting convertibles to which the Miata/MX5 certainly qualifies and a number of our members participate every year.



Whether you come for the evening to watch the cars roar through town, see all the cool cars parked in town, spend the day on a tour, or attend the vintage races at WGI, it's a great time. Saturday, July 30, Tour the National War Planes Museum

A trip back in time. On July 30th ten cars from the club joined in a ride from Victor, NY to Geneseo and the National Warplane Museum.

After this, lunch stop at Tom Wahl's in Avon, and then it was a short drive to the Museum located at a grass runway. A number of interesting airplanes are on display, including this C-130 Hercules, right, from the Vietnam era.

Among the flying aircraft at the Museum, the most-noted is the C-47 known as Whiskey-7 because of the large W7 on the forward fuselage, below.

This was one of the lead aircraft that dropped paratroopers in France on D-Day, June 6, 1944 as allied troops began the invasion that ultimately led to Germany's defeat during WW II.



In addition to the aircraft, members enjoyed seeing the many displays within the hangars and other buildings.

Fortunately, we were able to enjoy it in our shorts and tank tops. It was fascinating to see how the

TECHNICAL TIPS – “Wench With A Wrench”

Cleaning Your Drains

Here's another great maintenance suggestion that should be on your yearly check list - checking water drain holes from your convertible top to the ground to make sure they're clean and free-flowing. This is especially important on older Miatas if it's never been done but everyone should be aware.

Gunk, leaves, dirt and seeds accumulating in the drainage holes can plug up and back up water into the area behind your seat and into the interior panels of your car causing eventual rust. 😞

I found a great article (linked below in image) that explains how to clean Miata MX5 drainage holes for each generation of Miata MX5 (NA, NB, NC to 2014), since drain holes differ, to make sure they are clean and free-flowing.

This article does not address the Miata MX-5 ND (2015 to present). While it does have drainage filters and drain tubes behind each seat, removing and cleaning ND filters and drains is a bit more difficult

but not impossible. There is a small sponge filter that needs to be hosed clean as well as the plastic drain filter cleaned out and drainage tubes cleared. There are excellent YouTube videos demonstrating this by searching for [Cleaning Miata ND MX-5 filters and Drains](#). Be sure to watch both the videos for drains and the video for filters and clean BOTH the sponge, the plastic filter and the drain tubes on both sides of the car.

I might add, and I'm serious here, that a cheap trombone cleaner (an inexpensive small brush on the end of a flexible wire, see image above) from a music store or on the Internet, will do a pretty good job of reaming out the drain holes BUT you must be gentle as the article states so you don't break the small one-way flap within the drainage tube.

I hope this is of some interest and perhaps saves some dismay by finding water in the back of your Miata MX5.

Registration: To help streamline communications for gathering the list of who is attending our events, we will require members to contact the **Event Coordinator directly AND copy your Area Representative** to help them plan for caravans from your area. You will only need to respond if you are planning to attend, but if you need to cancel last minute, you still need to let both parties know so they don't hold up the ride waiting for you. Please pay close attention to the contact information and **deadlines**. When an accurate or advanced headcount is required, please do not just show up for an event. Register ahead of time with the event coordinator and your Area Representative.

Guest Waiver: Here is the [guest waiver form](#). If you are going to bring a guest, then you must print, complete, and give it to the Area Representative or Event Coordinator.

Rules: [Caravan Rules](#) to consider before the event. Sunscreen, sunglasses, hat, or visor are recommended. Make sure that your gas tank is full and your bladder is empty.

Reports: When writing the after-event report, try to include what people enjoyed. Everyone enjoys hearing about the people and people in or next to their Miata/MX5s.
