





Help for Minor Repair - NB "Floppy" Cup Holder Lid

Is the lid on your NB center console cup holder floppy? Does it pop open at the slightest touch or bump in the road? Mine was and it really bothered me. We thought about putting Velcro or a weight on underside of the lid but that seemed like too much of a cob job. So, the next step of course was: To The Internet!

After some searching, I found a <u>YouTube video by Gordon Tarpley</u> that showed the problem and the solution for it.

This guy did a really great job in the video showing the disassembly, repair and reassembly for the job. It takes a little bit of work to remove the center console, but it is only 5 screws. And, if your car is like mine, you'll find exactly where the mice were hanging out that one winter you found some evidence of mice when you got the car out in the spring.

Here's a picture of my cupholder with the repair before reassembly into the center console.



While you have cup holder out, check that the pivot collar on the lid has not been damaged. Mine was starting to split so I added some superglue to reinforce it.

Guest Waiver: Here is the <u>guest waiver form</u>. If you bring a guest, you must print, complete, and give it to the Area Representative or Event Coordinator. Just one part.

Rules: Caravan Rules to consider before the event. We suggest you bring sunscreen, sunglasses, a hat, or a visor. Be sure you have a full tank of gas and your bladder is empty.

Reports: You should include what people enjoyed in your post-event report. Everyone enjoys hearing about the people and seeing people in or standing next to their Miata/MX-5s.


