Should we have a live meeting, you may bring your completed ballot to the Annual Planning meeting and hand-deliver it to the Club Secretary instead of mailing it if you choose to vote.





TECHNICAL TIPS

RAINDROPS KEEP FALLING ON MY....FEET!

Hello Miata Club Folks.

I just had an interesting problem with my 2006 NC Miata, Ms. Scarlet, that I thought I would share. Apparently this is a common Miata problem of which I was unaware.

After a rainfall, dampness would mysteriously appear in the passenger side foot well. I keep Scarlet outside but well-covered and have never had this problem until a few weeks ago.

After consulting the on-line "Miata Forum" (a great resource) after tearing the front of my car at the windshield apart, I discovered that under the black plastic cowl under the windshield (after removing the screws, wiper arms, washer nozzle hose to remove the entire black plastic cowl) there is a small oval cover on either side of the windshield. We (Husband with the Tools) and I removed the covers and beneath a screw was the leak



point! The plastic plug has a sponge gasket beneath it that was totally disintegrated with age and I could clearly see that it was soaked and that this was the leak point problem.

We applied silicone sealant inside the screw hole and around the plastic plugs on BOTH sides to prevent further leaks including the driver's side.

Worth pulling apart if you're handy or having your mechanic check it out for you if you're having foot well leak problems that don't appear from coming from normal drain holes or the convertible top.

Thanks to my husband Steve, for writing about how to address this leak specifically. This is the link to detailed instructions.

Thanks for reading and remember, if you take care of your Miata, it'll take care of you on the road!

- Rather reliable and easy to own. Available options included air-conditioning, anti-lock brakes and even cruise control. Most cars came with the slick-shifting five-speed box. Mazda still offers a detachable hardtop, and the trunk is usable, too.
- Long competition pedigree, especially in SCCA autocross and club racing.
- Huge aftermarket support, from restoration and hop-up parts to turbo kits and even V8 swaps. Lots of cars built also means lots of good, used items on the market.

Shopping Advice by Our Experts: Ryan Passey and Greg Lee of Good-Win Racing

- You change the oil and keep it full of coolant, and they'll pretty much run forever. You really have to try to blow one up. The timing belts do seem to go, on the clock, at 100,000 miles (not 60,000), but it's a non-interference motor. They don't have those gotchas.
- There's nothing on the car that, if it wears out, you can't get it. It's sort of the classic car that's future-proofed.
- There are no tricky things like, "You better go to school for a while before touching this." No special tools required.
- The 1.6 has the smaller bits, so it's lighter. Some people like that simplicity. They say that the very early short nose crank (only in certain early years) can be an Achilles' heel, but it's not a death sentence.
- They had plastic tanks on the radiators. If it's old and changing color, might want to think about a new radiator. (on the NC 2006-2015, change the plastic coolant reservoir as it is under compression.)
- The lifter tick: They all do it.
- A new top is about \$700 and about the same to install.
- You never want a car that's really afflicted by rust. The car has two drain channels around the top, behind the seat belt towers, and those are notorious for getting clogged with debris and leaves. Always check that rear parcel shelf.
- The motor was originally designed for a front-drive car, so an oil change is always a mess. My personal car has a remote filter. Or you can make a little catch tray.

- What disqualifies a car? An automatic. And swapping transmissions is way more trouble than it's worth. There are wiring issues. It's physically possible, but you'll get a check-engine light.
- I'd look for an R Package if looking for the best to drive. If you're going to collect something, an M Edition.
- There's the potential out there to find the very cool color, the very cool package. If you have one that's low-mileage, the right package, that's a car to hold on to for a long time.
- You can have that old, classic, lightweight feel without the reliability issues and mechanical gremlins that come with a lot of the other cars that fall in that category.
