Friday, September 8, Watkins Glen Vintage Weekend

Every year, on the Friday after Labor Day, Watkins Glen celebrates the Grand Prix Festival. For those of you who are unfamiliar with racing and Finger Lakes history, in 1948, Watkins Glens hosted the first post-World War II auto race in the USA. Cars raced on the local roads including running straight through the middle of town. The racing continued each year until following a fatal accident in the 1952 race, after which the race moved to a dedicated track and later to its current facility now called Watkins Glen International (WGI).

The weekend after Labor Day, WGI hosts a weekend of Sportscar Vintage Racing Association (SVRA) vintage car racing. On the Friday, many of these vintage race cars come down from



WGI en masse, lap the 6.6 mile "old course" (which still exists pretty much as it did in 1948) and park on Franklin St for the evening. Spectators line the streets to celebrate a tribute to the return of these vintage racers to the village of Watkins Glen. During the day, a number of "tours" are held for the auto enthusiasts where you drive your car along a prescribed course, have a group lunch, do laps of the old course, park in a group and generally have a good time. One of these is the "Sporting Roadster Tour". This is limited to sporting convertibles to which the Miata/MX5 certainly qualifies and a number of our

members participate every year.

Whether you come for the evening to watch the cars roar through town, see all the cool cars parked in town, spend the day on a tour, or attend the vintage races at WGI, it's a great time. I encourage you all to check it out! See GrandPrixFestival.com for full details.




Back on the road, there was the thrill of a series of hills unofficially known as "The Roller Coaster."



Here is a Miata vacation story, from Al and Merrilee MacWilliams, that Club Members might find interesting.

On Tuesday, August 8, Merrilee & I left home on a Miata Trip to the Atlantic Provinces of Canada. A friend was loaning us an "Ocean View" house in a small town in Nova Scotia for a week, and we were going to get there in our 2008 Miata! It sounded like fun to us!

It rained all day Tuesday, and we spent the night in a hotel in Morristown, VT.

On Wednesday the weather was better and we crossed the rest of VT (see pic of car in front of the general store in Danville, VT., see link for more pictures, remove the





Thursday was a beautiful day, and our house in NS didn't become available until Saturday, so we put the car on the ferry to Deer Island and cruised around it with the top down. At one end of the Island you are right across a tidal inlet from Eastport, ME. (picture of car in line for the next ferry off the Island.) We were back at our hotel by noon, so decided to go to McAdam, NB as an afternoon trip. McAdam is buried in the woods, one of those places that the residents have to come OUT to hunt! It only exists because the Canadian Pacific RR's steam locomotives needed maintenance on the run between Halifax and Montreal in the first half of the Twentieth

Century. There is a great old station in town that is being restored, so we toured it (picture). Merrilee's phone, which we were using to navigate, had lost reception on the way to McAdam, so we picked a more direct, but remote, route going back. A straight road south, paralleling the US border, with nothing but rocks, trees, and bugs, no cell phone reception... and the car's temperature gauge started climbing! Now I know as well as anyone that I SHOULD have stopped, but we had no tools, no water, no phone reception, so I slowed down and limped

back to the Trans Canada Highway. There, a lady in a business gave me a couple of margarine tubs of water, before closing up and going home for the night! I got the car cooled down, filled the radiator jug up with water, and we started the 27 km drive along the Trans Canada Highway back to our hotel. I made it about a mile, then pulled over. Merrilee called a tow truck, and an hour later we were riding in a Kenworth instead of a Miata! The tow truck driver dropped us at our hotel, then took the car to his garage. They would check it over the next day and let us know what was wrong.



Friday we sat in our hotel room in the rain all day waiting to hear about the car. No rental cars were available. When COVID-19 hit all the rental companies sold off their fleets as no one was renting them, and they have been slow to replace the cars. At 3 PM the garage called. They thought the Miata had a blown head gasket, and they were not interested in working on it! And now it was late Friday afternoon!

SO, we decided to write off this vacation! We booked seats on the Saturday morning flight from St John, NB to Toronto (an hour and a half flight), and our son drove to Toronto and picked us up. (An hour crossing the Lewistown Bridge!) So by Saturday night, 8/12, we were back home again, less Miata!

On Sunday I managed to borrow a neighbor's big, enclosed car trailer, but, it had not been licensed yet this year! On Monday he got it licensed, and we figured out how to get a borrowed trailer back into the USA without it being impounded! I got my truck loaded with camping gear, and was eastbound by 5 AM Tuesday morning! A little over 600 miles to Bangor, ME where I spent the night in a Walmart parking lot. I was too tired to go looking for a state park to camp in! Wednesday I was rolling by 5 AM, crossed into Canada, got my car loaded with the help of the garage owner's sons, and got back into Maine with no problems! By the time I passed my Walmart parking lot at 1 PM. I'd already gone 312 miles! On to southern Maine, where I stopped in a I-95 service area, relaxed, ate, and waited for Boston commuters to get home. Back on the Interstate at 7 PM in the rain, and I was around Boston by 9:30, then headed west on I-90 until I stopped for the night in a service area at 11 PM. After two hours of sleep in the passenger's seat of the truck I was so uncomfortable that I hit the road again and drove from 1 until 3 AM. Two more hours of sleep, then I finished the drive home! So I was home by 9:30 on Thursday morning! What a vacation!

For anyone interested, the garage owner in New Brunswick says the cause of the trouble was a radiator cap which didn't hold enough pressure! I had checked the radiator before we started the trip, but did not check it again after that. So he felt that it had slowly leaked down over the two days of driving 400 miles a day, until it was low enough to overheat. I'd like to hear any opinions on this from the Club's "Wench with a Wrench", Gail Wagner.

Gail Wagner, The Wench With a Wrench, answers to Al: It's unclear if you resolved your problem with a tightened or new coolant reservoir cap but if not, here's some thoughts:

Firstly, determine WHERE the leak is coming from. If you're losing coolant, it's obviously leaking somewhere. Don't drive at all, if possible, when your engine is overheating.

- 1. NC's (2006-2015s) are the only generation of Miata's that have an enclosed pressurized cooling system. If the plastic coolant reservoir has a crack or small leak, or compromised in any way, coolant will leak out and cause serious engine overheating and possibly totally ruin your engine if you run with no coolant. (Note: I wrote a Tech column about replacing the plastic tank with a metal one in the Club newsletter, September 2020. Link here.)
- 2. Blown Head Gasket: Probably not but you would have definitely seen white smoke coming out of your exhaust. Check the dip stick: if the oil is high on the dip stick level indicator, there is water in the oil indicating a blown head gasket.
- 3. Could be any of the following:
- Is the radiator drain plug tight and the gasket good?
- Is the radiator leaking?
- Are there faulty radiator hoses or loose hose connections?
- Has the water pump failed? (This is a fairly inexpensive replacement.)
- Is there a faulty thermostat?
- Is the coolant reservoir cap not on tight or faulty?
- Could be the serpentine belt if the water pump is not working?
