



President's Letter

Welcome to summer! As I sit here preparing my article for July the heat index is 103 degrees. I love the heat (and hate air conditioning) but this is a little over the top and very dangerous. I hope you're all taking the warnings to heart and using the recommended precautions. Stay safe.

I also hope you all have at least one ride on your upcoming calendars. There's two left in June, three in July and five in August. Plenty to choose from and lots of fun to be had. And don't forget ice cream nights!

Speaking of upcoming events, you should have received an email with a survey form with three questions regarding our last event of the year. There were only three questions (on purpose) to keep it simple as to get a pulse on what direction to take. To my surprise and delight we received 68 responses, which was a great 'sampling' of opinions. With 122 cars at last count, that's pretty good. I don't know if both members per car responded, but the results certainly help.

To sum it up:

Question 1 indicated that 54.5% preferred an event in their local area and 45.5% wanted to have a club-wide event that includes all chapters and their members.

Question 2 indicates an equal number (39.4% each) of respondents wanting a 'Wrap up' party in place of a Holiday party, with 21.2% not liking the idea at all.

Question 3 showed a clear favorite (64.4%) for the event to be held on Saturday vs. Sunday which had 35.6% favorability.

Just an idea...we could also plan chapter events but open registration to anyone from other chapters to join if they'd like to.

OK, that's my input for now. I'll be sure to share who is on the Wrap Up party committees as soon as I get the volunteers. Thank you all who took the time to return the survey!!!

Saturday, July 12 - Tour of the Mount Morris Dam

** NOTE NEW MEETING PLACE AND TIME **

Know to some as "The Sleeping Giant," the Mount Morris Dam on the Genesee River at the southern end of Letchworth Gorge is the largest of its type east of the Mississippi.

Meeting place &time: McDonalds parking lot 35 Spencerport Road, Rochester, NY at 9:00am. We will depart no later than 9:30am to get to the Dam for a tour that starts at 11am. There is a guided walking tour that includes going inside and atop the dam. However, be aware that includes a one-mile round trip down a very steep walkway with a 10-percent grade. That part of the tour is not considered accessible for anyone with difficulty walking. Wear comfortable shoes and dress for the weather. Also, temperatures inside the dam is 40 to 50 degrees year round. Motion and still photographs are not permitted inside the dam. However, photos are allowed outside and on top of the structure. Backpacks/bags are not permitted inside the dam; please plan to leave any personal belongings in your vehicle if you are going on the walking tour. Fortunately for those of us unable to do the walking tour there are still spectacular views of the dam from an overlook at parking lot level plus displays and ample signage with info as well as a video.

Following the tour, we'll head out to lunch in Mt. Morris and then roll out to Geneseo for ice cream. I will need to know how many are going to join this excursion by July 5 so I can reserve tickets, which, by the way, are free.

Have you ever wondered what kind of event an Artificial Intelligence (AI) app would dream up? Join us on August 16 and find out! We'll go behind the scenes and share how it all came together. It'll be a great event and we hope to see you there!

We'll head south from Spencerport on roads the AI thinks we will like in our MX-5s. The first part will be mostly sweeping turns and hills. This year's Exploratorium is a repeat of the 2022 event, using the same clues and answers from that original adventure. If you missed it, or want another try, now's your chance!

Enjoy a scenic drive through the Finger Lakes as you individually explore new roads and solve a mystery-style challenge! The drive covers about 80 miles on paved, good-condition roads. This is not a rally or poker run—it's just for fun!

- · A map showing all locations.

Your mission is to match each clue with the correct location. You plan your own route. Each Miata can go a different way! Most answers are visible from the main roads; a few may require a short walk (up to 100 feet). Some clues are easy, some a bit more challenging, but none are tricky or hard to understand.







You will only need to respond if you are planning to attend, but if you need to cancel at the last minute you need to let both the Event Coordinator and Area Representative know so they do not to hold up the ride waiting for you. Register ahead of time with the Event Coordinator and your Area Representative.
