Know to some as "The Sleeping Giant," the Mount Morris dam on the Genesee river at the southern end of Letchworth Gorge is the largest of its type east of the Mississippi. Serious flooding in the Rochester area in the 1700s and 1800s prompted its construction by the Army Corps of Engineers between 1948 and 1951. It is credited with preventing an estimated one billion dollars in flood damage over the decades since it was completed. Over a thousand feet long, it stands 246 feet above the river bed. The concrete in it would be enough to pave a 300 mile long two-lane highway.

There is a guided walking tour that includes going inside and atop the dam. However, be aware that includes a one mile round trip down a very steep walkway with a 10 percent grade. They advise wearing comfortable shoes and dressing for the weather. Also, the temperature inside the dam is 40 to 50 degrees year round. This tour is not considered accessible for anyone with difficulty walking. Fortunately for those of us in that last category, there are still spectacular views of the dam from an overlook at parking lot level plus displays and ample signage with info, as well as a video.

Motion and still photographs are not permitted inside the dam. However, photos are allowed outside and on top of the structure. Backpacks/bags are not permitted inside the dam; please plan to leave any personal belongings in your vehicle if you are going on the walking tour. The tour starts at 11:00 am, so we will plan to be there well before that.

Wench With A Wrench

SUMMER ENGINE FLUIDS FLUSH/REPLACEMENT & OTHER IMPORTANT STUFF

Hello, Miata Club Members.

Summertime and the livin' (and drivin') is easy. But it's also time to pay attention to your Miata innards/outers to make sure she/he is running smoothly and efficiently without unanticipated costly repairs due to neglected maintenance.

Please read through these suggestions and if your Miata qualifies, get to it now. Many of our Miata's are over or well-over twenty years old! We forget about age because they are relatively trouble-free. Let's keep it that way. Paying attention to fluids replacement and other maintenance reminders will help keep your Miata trouble-free and running well for many years to come.

- TIRE PRESSURE/ROTATION Check tire pressure monthly. Correct tire pressure should be
 in your owner's manual or on a sticker on the inside of your driver's side door. Rotate your
 tires every 2,000 3,000 miles. (I have my inspection shop do it every year or do it myself.)
 Rotating tires prevents uneven wear and is good for fuel efficiency not to mention helping to
 make your tires last longer.
- TIRE REPLACEMENT THIS IS A BIGGIE, FOLKS. Important: Tires 7-10 years old have expired and should be replaced <u>regardless</u> of how much tread is left. Tires can degrade from the inside unseen. (Tip: Read my previous columns about tires on our Club website <u>www.midstatemiata.net</u>, May 2025 newsletter) The tires are the most important thing between your butt and the road. Make sure they're safe!
- TIRE ALIGNMENT Have your alignment checked every couple of years at least. Even if you don't buy new ties and have alignment and tire balancing done then, have your alignment checked on your current tires. It will improve handling and help prevent early tire wear.
- TIRE LUG NUTS Check monthly. If you have a torque wrench and a socket set, check your tire's lug nuts and tighten to spec, usually about 80 ft-lbs. of torque or have your mechanic check them. This can be easily overlooked if you have had your tires replaced or rotated recently.
- ANTI-FREEZE/COOLANT Mazda recommends flush and replacement every five years or every 30,000 miles. Antifreeze, also known as coolant, keeps the engine and its components

from freezing or overheating. The chemicals in antifreeze eventually break down and lose their engine-cooling protective properties. Driving a vehicle with a faulty engine cooling system can result in overheating, cylinder head gasket failure, engine block failure, or cylinder head warping. Read \$\$\$\$\$... Additionally, if you have a 2006-2015 "NC" series Miata, keep an eye on the plastic overflow reservoir. If it turns green or brown, replace ASAP. A leak or crack can damage your engine big time! (This is the only generation of Miata to have a plastic reservoir that can cause engine interference).

- POWER STEERING FLUID REPLACEMENT If never flushed and replaced and you have at least 55,000 miles, think about it. Power steering fluid does break down eventually and can cause "gunk" to accumulate in the power steering lines affecting steering. The fresh fluid color should be translucent cherry red (not dark brown or black) just in case you see any that has leaked on your driveway. At least check it once a month to see if it needs topping up. Use the correct stuff per manual.
- AIR FILTER Replace after 60 months or 60,000 miles. The new "permanent" filters are nice.
 You just take them out and vacuum occasionally. Worth the added expense, I say. If you
 don't wrap your air filter in aluminum foil during winter storage or long-time un-use, you'd be
 surprised what stuff critters can store in there.
- CABIN FILTER Replacement per manual. If you don't change your interior cabin air filter,
 the filter will become more clogged with dirt and debris and compromise the efficiency of the
 filter and your car's HVAC system, if you have A/C. The air volume into your passenger compartment will be continually reduced leading to the issue of odors inside your car. (Tip: Easy
 to buy one and do it yourself. Check it out on YouTube).
- PRAKE FLUID/CLUTCH FLUID Check the fluid reservoir bottle monthly and completely flush/replace with "DOT 3" brake fluid every 2-3 years since it does break down eventually. Brake and clutch fluid (same fluid) are located in the same little plastic bottle under the hood. Throw out partially used cans of brake fluid after 2 years at the latest if you add it yourself; it degrades because it attracts moisture from the air (hygroscopic), even a partially used, closed container on your garage shelf (Tip: I mark the date I opened the bottle with a magic marker so I know how old it is). If you are a "spirited" driver who brakes hard a lot or someone who does high performance track days, it's recommended that you use higher temperature DOT 4 brake fluid indicated on the bottle as opposed to DOT 3.
- DIFFERENTIAL FLUID Drain and replace every 30,000 miles per Mazda's factory recommendation. The "diff" transfers power from the transmission to the rear wheels and lets the wheels turn at different speeds when cornering. It is one of the most expensive parts to replace. Be sure to use the right kind per manual. If you don't think it's ever been changed, do it now.
- TRANSMISSION FLUID FOR MANUAL & AUTOMATIC Drain and replace every 30,000 miles per Mazda's factory recommendation. Be sure to use the right kind per manual. The

fluid is not only a lubricant but it also serves to prevent corrosion and actuate the clutches inside the transmission that perform the smooth shifts. Over time, when heat breaks down the fluid, it loses some of its capabilities.

- PVC VALVE (Positive Crankcase Ventilation) Replace every 20,000 50,000 miles. If you normally drive short trips, change every 30,000 miles. The PCV valve is a one-way valve attached to the crankcase of your car's engine and removes unwanted gases from the crankcase. (Tip: See my past TECH article about PVC valves in website archives).
- FUEL FILTER Replace every 60,000 miles. (If it's plugged, believe me, you'll know, (i.e., lack of power, especially driving up hills!).
- SPARK PLUGS/ SPARK PLUG WIRES –Check both monthly (if you have plug wires; newer models do not). Replace about every 30,000 miles. When was the last time you had these changed? If you don't know, do it now. Have spark plugs and spark plug wires checked (e.g., cracks, breaks, broken covering) for older Miata's and the spark plugs for the newer models which have "coil packs" in place of wires. (Normally these packs do not need regular replacement).
- TIMING BELT -????? Well, the jury is still out on this. Are you a reasonable gambler? Some say replace after 60,000 miles BUT reported failures appear to be few and far between and it doesn't hurt the engine if the belt does break you're just unable to drive the car until it's replaced. The replacement is expensive, like \$600+. (Tip: It's recommended that you replace the water pump at the same time, a relatively inexpensive part, if you do replace the belt since it's buried "down under there").
- RAIN DRAINS Check periodically. These are the little holes under your convertible top that drain rainwater and hand car-washing water down and away from the car. They can plug with dirt, grit, leaves, etc., allowing water to back up into your interior cabin floor or trunk. (Tip: Run a garden hose on the back of your car with the top securely up and then with the top half-way folded down (have someone hold it or put a box under it to hold it from falling). Have someone peek underneath the back of the car to make sure water stream is draining properly).
- ENGINE HOSES Check monthly. Take a quick peek at all your engine hoses and hose clamps to make sure there are no leaks, cracks, breaks or any have come loose that takes just a minute. Replace as necessary new hoses are cheap insurance AND they come in cool colors now.
- BATTERY FLUID/REPLACEMENT Check monthly and/or depends. Do you have a battery that requires adding water or a closed battery system? Unscrew those battery caps with a rag and top off with <u>distilled (not tap)</u> water if the cells look low on fluid. How OLD is your battery? Some have a date printed on top. Clean corroded battery terminals (that gunky white stuff) with a toothbrush and a paste made with water and baking soda, cleaned off with a rag

or paper towel. Please use rubber gloves, protective glasses and protect paint and clothing. This is <u>an acid</u> gunk. (Tip: You can have battery life tested and checked free at many auto supplies stores).

- WASH/WAX At least once a season. (See my archived article about washing and waxing at www.midstatemiata,net). To preserve your paint, especially on our older Miata's, your car should be hand-washed and waxed in spring after storage and ideally again mid-summer and just before storage. (I love the new ceramic coatings.) I'm talking washing "by-hand" here. Don't forget to condition leather seating if you have it with a quality leather preservative product. Clean and condition your convertible top with quality convertible top cleaner/conditioner products like RaggTop or equivalent (not car wash or detergent soap) to help it last longer and protect from harmful UV rays' deterioration. Yes, it's time consuming but so good for the soul!
- TREE SAP, DEAD BUGS AND OTHER PAINT-RUINING PROBLEMS Check every day! Tree sap, dead bugs and bird droppings can be ruinous on paint and clear coat. Wipe acidic bird droppings and dead bugs ASAP with a damp paper towel. Tree sap can be effectively removed with a few drops of waterless hand soap (i.e., Purell). On a warm day, let it sit for a minute on the sap to soften and then wipe it off with a wet paper towel to thoroughly remove the sap. Then wash with a little soap and water and then dry with a dry paper towel. (I have not found a sap-removing automotive product yet that really works as well as this).
- A tip: Got cloudy headlight lens that have oxidized overtime? I heartily recommend this product: Cerakote Headlight Restoration Kit. \$17 bucks but works great!

I hope this has been interesting and useful info. Take care of your Miata and it will take care of you! Gail


