We currently us a MS Word document but may change that in the next year, but will work with and train our volunteers as needed. We will produce a schedule for deadlines in February for the 2017 driving season so everyone will know when they need to get input to the Editor. Publication dates will be 7-10 days later to give the Editor time to produce it and send to the Area Reps for distribution.

Please review the description and skills needed below and get back to me or Rosemary DeHoog if you are interested or have any questions. It would be great to have 2 folks work together on it to help with production. Below is the description in the by-laws and some suggested updates in red:

**Section K. Newsletter Editor.** The Newsletter Editor shall be responsible for the creation and distribution of a monthly newsletter to the general membership. The Club newsletter shall be published not less than 6 times per year and is the official publication of the Club. Duties are as follows:

- Compiles articles and information submitted for publication
- Publishes a schedule of when articles are due to the Newsletter Editor by March 1<sup>st</sup> of each year.
- Full articles will be included in the newsletter 2 full months prior to the event date.
- Newsletters will be distributed to the Area Reps to be cascaded to membership.
- Work with another member to do a Peer Review for accuracy prior to publication.

Some of the skills need are as below:

Welcome New Members

- 1. Must be computer literate in Microsoft Word (other software may evolve if we change newsletter application)
- 2. Must be able to access and employ the Internet for mail services
- 3. Must be willing to work with the membership to meet the changing needs of the organization.

### Deadlines for newsletter input for the remaining of this year are as follows:

- August 24 deadline for September newsletter
- September 21 deadline for October newsletter
- October 20 deadline for any December event notifications/reservations
- Nov 16 final information for Holiday party reservations

So, if you might be interested in volunteering, let's talk. We will be at the Log Cabin next week and at the picnic at the end of the month. Hope to see you then...

The museum has over 150 classic cars on display. So allow a few hours to wander through. We will be getting group admission rates – which will be \$8.00 per person. The Museum is located at 24 Rexford Street Norwich, NY

We will gather for a "top down" drive at 9:30 AM in the Mc Donald's parking lot at 877 State Route 13 in South Cortland NY. (**not the Mc Ds off Rt 81**). From there we will caravan south
