SPECIAL RECOGNITION

The article that follows is from our long standing member and former Area Rep that we'd like to share with all of you. Joe recently took the Honor Flight trip and we asked him to share his memories with you. Thank you, Joe, for your article and your service to our club and our country! You deserved this trip!



TWIN TIERS HONOR FLIGHT

The honor flight is a non-profit organization that takes veterans on a trip to Washington DC to see the different war memorials. To qualify for the honor flight you had to be a veteran of World War II, Korea, or Vietnam. I was a veteran of the Korean Conflict. This is the Forgotten War, which lasted thirty seven months, in which we lost 54,246 men. It was one of the bloodiest wars we were ever in.

I landed in Korea on my 20th birthday, six months after the cease fire. This is no place a young man wanted to spend sixteen months. If you had told me then that someday I would be buying Korean tires for my Japanese sports car, I would say you were crazy.

On May 12, 2018 sixty vets and their guardians left on a cold and rainy day from Broome County Airport. When we arrived in Washington the sun was shining and the temperature was in the 70's. It was a beautiful day. In the airport there was hundreds of people there to greet us with a band playing military music. It made you feel like a celebrity. We traveled in three buses with a police escort everywhere we went. Our first stop was Arlington Cemetery, where we watched the changing of the guard at the tomb of the Unknown Soldier. That was real impressive. We left Arlington driving by the Marine memorial and the Air Force memorial. Our next stop was the World War II memorial. We had seven men from WWII. These men, all in their nineties were something to watch. It was really quite emotional for those who were here for the first time. We had a box lunch here before we left for the Lincoln Memorial where we walked, or were wheeled, to the

Korean and Vietnam memorials. Many vets spent time looking for names on the Vietnam Wall of people they had known. This too was emotional for some of the vets. It got hot in the afternoon, reaching ninety degrees.

We then left for a return trip to the airport, where again we were welcomed by a bunch of people and a band playing. People were still coming up to us, like they had all day, shaking our hand, thanking us for our service. I never had my hand shook so much. We had our dinner at the airport before boarding the plane for our flight home.

On the flight home we had mail call. We all received letters from friends congratulating us. This was a surprise, just another little thing that these people did for us.

When we arrived back home we were escorted to Hanger #1, where we left from in the morning. It was filled with people welcoming us back. As we entered the hanger each Vet was individually introduced by name, branch of service, and when you served.

It was a great day and one I will never forget. Everywhere you went you were treated like royalty. I recommend this to anyone who qualifies. It certainly does a lot for your self-esteem.
